### **ABSTRACT**

### **1. INTRODUCTION**

These guidelines include complete descriptions of the fonts, spacing, and related information for producing your full paper. The maximum length of the full paper is 8 pages.

### **2. FORMATTING YOUR PAPER**

All printed material, including text, illustrations, and charts, must be kept within a print area of 180 mm wide by 230 mm high. Do not write or print anything outside the print area. The top margin should be 25 mm.

### **3. PAGE TITLE SECTION**

The paper title (on the first page) should begin 35 mm from the top edge of the page, centered, completely capitalized, and in Times 12-point, boldface type. The authors' name(s) and affiliation(s) should appear below the title in capital and lower case letters. Papers with multiple authors and affiliations may require two or more lines for this information.

### **4. TYPE-STYLE AND FONTS**

All body text should be 10-point font size. Please do not double-space your paper.

### **5. MAJOR HEADINGS**

Major headings, for example, "1. Introduction", should appear in all capital letters, bold face, left justified in the column, with one blank line before, and one blank line after. Use a period (".") after the heading number, not a colon.

#### **5.1. Subheadings**

Subheadings should appear in lower case (initial word capitalized) in boldface. They should start at the left margin on a separate line.

##### *5.1.1. Sub-subheadings*

Sub-subheadings, as in this paragraph, are discouraged. However, if you must use them, they should appear in lower case (initial word capitalized) and start at the left margin on a separate line, with paragraph text beginning on the following line. They should be in italics.

## 6. PAGE NUMBERING

Please do **not** paginate your paper. Page numbers and conference identification will be inserted when the paper is included in the proceedings.

## 7. ILLUSTRATIONS, GRAPHS, AND PHOTOGRAPHS

Illustrations must appear within the designated margins. If possible, position illustrations at the top of page, rather than in the middle or at the bottom. Caption and number every illustration. All halftone illustrations must be clear black and white prints. Color may be used, but it should be clear when printed on a black-only printer.

## 8. COPYRIGHT

The copyright of the paper remains with the author.

## 9. REFERENCES INSTRUCTIONS

List and number all references at the end of the document. The references must appear in alphabetical order. When referring to them in the text, type the corresponding first author surname (for single author for example Cressie (1991)), first and second authors' surname (for two authors for example Berman & Diggle (1989)), first author surname et al. (three or more authors for example Ribeiro et al. (2003)) and year of publication, with/without round brackets as shown at the end of this sentence (Ribeiro et al., 2003).
